1) Obituary of Catherine Ann Phillips Fetters, THE FINDLAY MORNING REPUBLICAN September 25, 1919--Page Five.

Pioneer of County Dead at 92 years. Mrs. Katherine Anne Fetters passes away Wednesday. Came here at the age of seven from East, in Prairie Schooner. Lived in log cabin in wildernes. Katherine Anne Fetters, 92 years old, died from complication of diseases and infirmaties of age at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Louis Marshall on West Sandusky street at 11 o'clock Wednesday morning after having been bed-ridden for the last 11 months.

She was the daughter of Charles and Betsy Phillips, and was born Oct 9, 1826 in what was known as Waynesburg, Pa., now known as McVay. When she was seven years old, the family came to Ohio in a covered prairie schooner and settled on Tawa Creek, near Benton Ridge. The journey, which was long and difficult, took four weeks. A family by the name of Thompson came with the Phillips family, Mrs. Epley, living south of Findlay, being the only surviving member of this party.

The early pioneer life was a fascinating one and was full of interesting happenings. The first home, a rude hut, was snowed under for three days, and a later structure was scarcely adequate to afford protection from the wolves which howled around the door each night. All sorts of wild game was abundant, and the family larder was largely dependent upon the accuracy of Mrs. Fetter's husband's shooting.

An early episode in the life of the deceased occurred when she was 13 years old, at which time she and another girl rode on horseback to Findlay with some chickens to sell. The other girl disposed of her's for six cents each, while Mrs. Fetters sold hers for eight cents to the late Judge Cory.

At the age of 18 she was married to Peter Fetters and to this union 13 children were born, six of whom are dead. Those who are dead are: Andrew, a soldier in the Civil War, Mary Ellen Smith, Eli, Criselda, Elizabeth and Lemuel. The living are: Mrs. Sarah Bond, Deweyville: Mrs. Louis Marshall, Mrs. T. J. Baker and Irvin, in Findlay: Mrs. Clayton Vansant, Mich.: Uriah, Arlington, and Isaiah, Benton Ridge.

Mrs. Fetters was a member of the Powell Evangelical church, which she joined shorly after her marriage. During her later years she spent a great deal of time in making quilts, having made 55 during the last five years.

Funeral services will be held at 2 o'clock Friday afternnon at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Marshall, on West Sandusky street with interment in the Powell cemetery."

The "Autobiography of Katherine Anne Fetters, Author Unknown, (copied on Page 1 of book complied by me, Katherine Mae Bittell Krauth) states that Katherine Anne was born in Waynesburg, PA (as it was formerly known, but is now called McVay, Pa.)"

The Biography of Lloyd and Marie Bates by Marie (Sperow) Bates (page 7 of my book) states that "Catherine Ann was born in McVay, Berks Co., Pa."

A 1970 map shows a McVeytown in Mifflin Co., Pa.

At the Tallahassee State Library, I found this book, "A New & Complete Gazetteer of the U.S." by Baldwin. (Gen 910.3 B182) On page 1258, I found "Waynesburg, a small village of Mifflin Co., Pa." I believe Catherine was born in a small village in Mifflin Co., named Waynesburg and today it is called McVeytown.

"Shortly after the marriage, they were converted and received into membership at the Powell Evangelical Church which still stands on Powell Road at Hancock, Ohio." (From Tomas Fetters)
