

## George Bond & family

George Bond was born 25 August 1801 (birth date figured from date and age at death, 52years 4month 25days, on the tombstone) in Maryland. He died 19 January 1854 in Hancock County, Ohio and is buried in Maple Grove Cemetery, Sec A, Lot 213 Findlay, Ohio. He was married 25 December 1842 to Alice Routson born ca 1820 in Ohio. She was the daughter of John & Jane (Campbell) Routzon. Alice died before 15 January 1889 in Eagle Township, Hancock County, Ohio. Alice is buried on the same lot as George. She married Jonathan Williamson 17 August 1856 in Hancock County, Ohio. She and Jonathan had 4 children. James B. Williamson born 1857; Clarissia Williamson, born 1858; John W. Williamson born 1860; and Margaret A. Williamson born 1862.

### Children of George & Alice:

1) Albert Bond born 1844 in Eagle Twp., Hancock County, Ohio. Albert is 6 years old on the 1850 census, living with his parents, George and Alice Bond in Eagle Township, Hancock County, Ohio: 16 years old on the 1860 census living with his mother, Alice and Jonathan Williamson in Eagle Township, Hancock County, Ohio: 28 years old on the 1870 census listed with the Fleming family as a farm laborer. He purchased land in Eagle Township, Hancock County, Ohio, from Thomas Wyatt, 21 January 1865; from Joseph Poland in Jackson Township 30 September 1865; sold land to John Markle, 16 Jan 1865, and Joshua Hartman in Eagle Township, Hancock County, Ohio, 8 April 1865.

2) Amos K Bond born 1864 died 10 April 1864 London Tenn, buried in Chattanooga, Tenn. He is 4 years old on the 1850 census living with his parents in Eagle Township, Hancock County, Ohio.

Military records from the National Archives Washington, D.C.: Amos K. Bond appears with rank of Private on Muster and Descriptive roll of a Detachment of U.S. Volunteers forwarded for the 21 Regiment Ohio Infantry. The roll is dated Columbus, Ohio, Feb 3, 1864. It states that Amos was born in Hancock County, Ohio, is 18 years old and occupation farmer. He enlisted Jan. 30, 1864 at Findley, Ohio for a period of 3 years. He had blue eyes, light hair and complexion and is 5'11" tall. He mustered in Feb 2, 1864 at Columbus. He received a bounty of \$60.00 and is due \$240.00.

Private Amos K. Bond, Co I, 21 Regiment Ohio Infantry, appears on The Company Muster Roll for March and April, 1864 and states that he joined for duty and enrolled January 30, 1864 at Findley, Ohio for a period of 3 years. It also states that Amos was "deceased April 10, 1864 at London, Tenn. Joined as a Recruit. Mch. 10. \$40. 2nd Instal of Bounty."

Private Amos K. Bond, Co I, 21 Regiment Ohio Infantry, Age 18 years, appears on the Company Muster-Out Roll, dated Louisville, Kentucky, July 25, 1865 and

was last paid to February 29, 1864. His clothing account was last settled on January 30, 1864. He was paid \$10.00 and had due \$240.00. Remarks: "DIED OF TYPHOID FEVER APRIL 10/64"

It states on The Company Descriptive Book that Amos K. Bond County I, 21 Regiment Ohio Infantry is 19 years, 5'11" tall, Light complexion and hair, with blue eyes, was born in Hancock County, Ohio, Occupation, Farmer. He enlisted January 30, 1864 at Findlay, Ohio by Col Mibling for 1 year. Remarks: Recruit-died April 10/64 at London, Tennessee of typhoid fever.

Amos K. Bond Private, Company I, 21 Regiment Ohio Infantry appears on Returns as follows: March 1864. Gain. Mary. [I don't know what these abbreviations mean] 1864, Chattanooga. Enlisted in Regiment & assigned to Company I. Absent sick at Tyners Station Tennessee, March 18 1864. April 1864, Loss April 10 1864 Loudon Tennessee, Died of disease.

The book, HISTORY OF HANCOCK COUNTY OHIO by Jacob A Spaythe (Book at McComb Public Library, McComb, Ohio) States on page 223 that 30 January 1864, Amos K. Bond, was a Private in the Ohio Volunteer Infantry Company I. On page 286, he is listed on the "Roll of Honor" of the 21st Regiment Ohio Volunteer Infantry. On page 287, Amos K. Bond of Company I, a private, died 4 April 1864 at Chattanooga of typhoid fever and is buried in Chattanooga, Tennessee.

3) Aaron D. Bond born 11 May 1846 in Hancock County, Ohio, died 6 Jun 1922, also in Hancock County, Ohio. Aaron married 28 January 1872 Sarah Lavina Fetters. She was born 3 April 1851 in Hancock County, Ohio, daughter of Peter & Catherine Ann (Phillips) Fetters. Sarah died 11 March 1920 in Hancock County, Ohio and buried 13 March 1920 in McComb Cemetery, Findlay, Ohio. See more of this family in summary of Aaron Bond.

4) Arthur W. Bond, was born 1 March 1850 in Hancock County, Ohio. He married Mary E. Whitaker on 31 August 1879, and I found that they had at least seven children. Lula Blanche, born 13 August 1880 (Records of Births Book 2A 1880-1891 Page 11, Findlay, Ohio); Orpha, born 18 January 1883. Same record book as above Page 14. Same mother but father listed as William Bond. [Here I go assuming again, but I think Arthur's middle name may have been William.]; Olive Gail, born 30 April 1889 (same record book Page 29 #960); Mary Ann, born 4 October 1891 (Records of Births book 3 1892-1903 same Twp. and County Page 9 #67); Goldie, born 10 August 1896 (same Book 3, Page 19 #516) and son, Harry Bond, born 10 May 1886 (Records of Births - Vol 2A 1880-1891 Page 22 #678 Findlay, Ohio) and daughter, Sarah Bond listed in Arthur's will. I didn't find a birth record for Sarah  
born 1 March 1850 in Hancock County, Ohio, died 24 August 1914 in Marion Township, Hancock county, Ohio.

Page 205 at the courthouse in Findlay, Ohio.

"Arthur W. Bond. Resident of Marion Twp. died on or about 24 August 1914.  
Mary E. Bond, his widow resides in Marion Twp and administrator; Lulu Blanche  
Lyons, daughter, Cannonsburgh, Pennsylvania; Orpha Morgan, daughter,  
Findlay, Ohio; Harry Bond, son, Findlay, Ohio; Gail Bond, daughter, East  
Liverpool, Ohio; Anna Coleman, daughter, Findlay, Ohio RFD 7; Sarah Bond,  
daughter, Findlay, Ohio RFD2; Goldie Bond, daughter, Findlay, Ohio RFD 7;  
First--debts and funeral be paid; wife, Mary E. Bond, personal property including  
stock and crops, harvested or now growing, also real estate - E1/2 NE1/4 SW1/3  
Sec 10 Twp 1 NR 11E as lies north of center of the Findlay and Tiffin state road  
and strip of land about 1 rod wide lying between said premises herein before  
described and lands owned by Blackfords. ...after death of wife all real estate to  
daughter Sarah J. Bond.

5) Allen A. Bond died 8 February 1854 at the age of 1 year 1 month 1 day. This information was taken from a tombstone on the grave of George Bond in Maple Grove Cemetery, Findlay, Hancock County, Ohio. Birth date figured from date and age at death, 7 January 1853

6) Orpha Jane Bond Orpha Bond, daughter of George and Alice Bond, was born 24 February 1854 in Eagle Township, Hancock County, Ohio. Following is an item from THE REPUBLICAN-COURIER, FINDLAY, OHIO, TUESDAY MORNING, February 24, 1948. The article was given to me by Florence (Grose) Ward.

"MADISON TOWNSHIP'S OLDEST RESIDENT 94 YEARS TODAY  
Born in Eagle township about three miles southwest of Findlay, Mrs. Orpha Garling, Madison township's oldest resident, will celebrate her 94th birthday today at the home of her son-in-law and daughter, Mr. And Mrs. G. G. Oldham, west of Williamstown. Mrs. Garling is the seventh child and only daughter of Mr. & Mrs. George Bond. Her father died about a month before her birth. At the age of five years she went to live with her grandparents, Mr. And Mrs. John Routzon, who resided on what is now known as East Bigelow Avenue. Although the passing years have marred her ability in taking part in present day happenings, she never tires in relating tales of her childhood and often recalls when Findlay's courthouse was the crude structure of the early 60s, when the old covered bridge spanned the Main street river crossing, when horse-drawn vehicles were common on Main street, when the farmer's dog watched to keep cattle and hogs from roaming the streets, from stealing hay from his masters sled and eggs were sorted at grocery stores and the undesirable ones tossed into the gutter before the front door. Mrs. Garling went to housekeeping in 1874 with her husband W. E. Garling, in a home near Findlay. Later they bought and cleared a farm in Delaware township where they reared their five children. In 1914 they moved to Arlington living a retired life until Mr. Garling's death in 1919. Mrs. Garling did her own housework and gardening until four years ago when failing health made it inadvisable for her to live alone. Fifteen of her 17 grandchildren are living. She also has 13 great grandchildren and one great great grandson. At the home of her daughter she still takes interest in chickens and flowers and occasionally reads the Republican-Courier, which has been a constant visitor in her home since 1874. Her chief delight, however, is relating to her grandchildren stories of her childhood days at Grandpa's."

Orpha J. Bond born 24 Feb 1854 never knew her father. He died a month before she was born. She married William E. Garling on 7 November 1874. William E. Garling was born 13 December 1854 in Logan County, Ohio. He died 12 April 1919. They had 5 children: George Gilbert Garling, born 19 August 1875 in Hancock County, Ohio; Dora Bell Garling born 6 March 1879 in Hardin County,

Ohio, married 12 September 1925 to John C. Smith; Grace May Garling born 18 February 1886; Carrie Blanche Garling born 27 February 1890; Lena Maria Garling born in 1892.
