# The United States of America,

To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

KNOW YE, That John P. Bond of Brooke County, Virginia, having deposited in the Treasury a certificate of the Register of the Land-office at Steubenville, whereby it appears that he has made full payment for the North East Quarter of Section number Thirty two, of Township number Ten, in Range number Four, of the lands directed to be sold at Steubenville, by the act of Congress, entitled "An act providing for the sale of the lands of the United States in the territory north-west of the Ohio, and above the mouth of Kentucky river," and of the acts amendatory of the same, THERE IS GRANTED, by the United States, unto the said John P. Bond, the Quarter, lot or section of land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said Quarter, lot or section of land, with the appurtenances, unto the said John P. Bond his heirs and assigns forever.

This patent is granted as and for a patent intended to have been granted and issued on November 30, 1811, but the issuance of which is not sufficiently evidenced by the records of the Bureau of Land Management.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, the undersigned authorized officer of the Bureau of Land Management, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of June 17, 1948 (62 Stat. 476), has, in the name of the United States, caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the Bureau to be hereunto affixed.
