"James Judd, son of No. (22) Benjamin Judd and No. (23) Susanna North, married Hannah (Andrus) daughter of Daniel, jun. and Mabel (Goff,) his wife, b Sept 8th, 1723, near Wethersfield line, at the "Great Swamp." They lived on the old homestead of his father; owned the saw-mill long known as "Judd's Mill;" he d. Feb 15th, 1783, aged 66; his widow d Dec 29th 1789, aged 67, with the following on her head-stone: "Blessed and happy are those who die in the Lord."
